We invite both empirical and theoretical contributions, and researchers from a range of disciplinary and methodological traditions working on projects in the United States and internationally.

The conference will take place at the beautiful Asilomar Conference Center, adjacent to the Pacific Ocean, where it never snows!

Please submit a detailed 2-3 page précis that includes a brief discussion of the topic, research literature, methods, and significance of the paper to Michal Kurlaender (2013 Program Chair) at the University of California, Davis (seaconference@ucdavis.edu). Please include the following information with your submission: Name, Affiliation, Address, Office Telephone, and E-mail of contact person. Please also indicate whether the primary author is a graduate student.

The submission deadline is October 10, 2012. The SEA Board of Directors will respond to authors by November 27, 2012.

Membership is not required to submit a proposal, but all presenters and conference attendees must pay membership dues to attend, thereby becoming members for one year commencing with the start of the conference.
